	PROBLEM SOLVING WITH BGLS	ADVANCED PUMPING WORKSHOP
	This workshop focuses on problem solving around blood glucose levels (BGLs), particularly with respect to insulin pump data. It builds on the pump workshop in the ADS Practical Skills Course and is recommended for first year trainees.	This workshop builds on the "Problem solving with BGLs" workshop and is recommended for second and third year trainees. It addresses supporting advanced problem solving around insulin pumps using pump downloads.

	CARBOHYDRATE COUNTING	EXERCISE AND DIABETES
	This workshop provides an introduction to carbohydrate counting, focusing on whole foods, label reading and recipe analysis. It will also address other factors, such as glycaemic index, fat and protein, that can impact on post-prandial BGLs. It is suitable for first year trainees but other trainees who have not previously attended the workshop are welcome to attend.	This workshop explores issues around managing BGLs in the context of exercise in type 1 diabetes. It includes scenarios about BGL management in elite athletes. This workshop is designed for second and third year trainees.

	WORKSHOP E (Room 2)	DIABETES IN PREGNANCY
